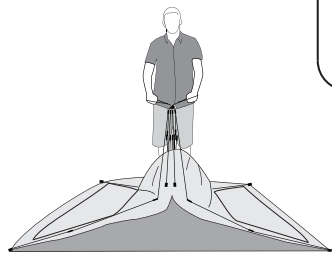
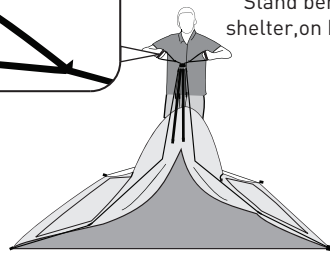
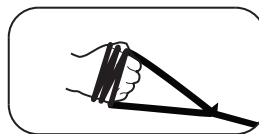


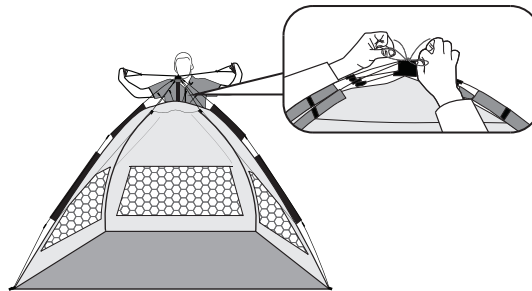
**SET UP**

Lay shelter flat with central hub upright.  
Make sure poles are fully extended and pole joints are in the locked position.

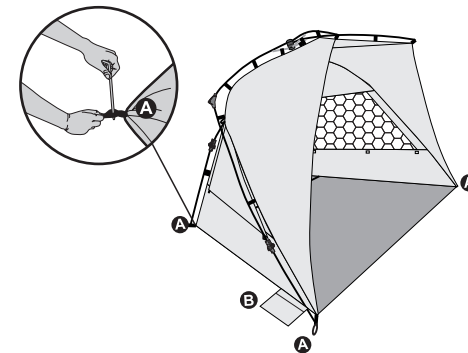


Stand behind the shelter, on back side

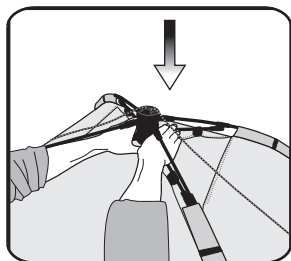
Pull the two cords up and out away from each other.  
Wrap one or more coils to make the cords shorter and easier to pull.



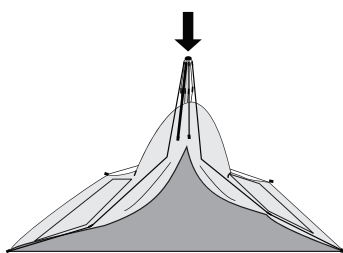
Continue to pull cords until the upper and lower sections of the hub meet.  
As the hub gets closer to connecting, the resistance will increase and the shelter will bow out.  
Once connected, tie the two cords into a bow.



Stake down the corners of the shelter to secure it in place (A).  
Sand pockets can be filled for additional stability (B).

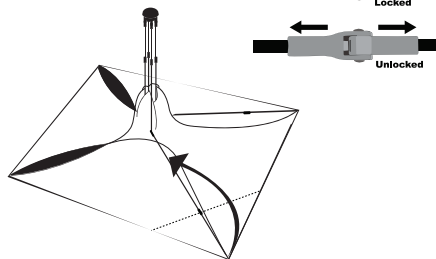
**TAKE DOWN**

Remove stakes and empty sand pockets  
Untie cords and separate central hub by pushing down on the lower hub poles.

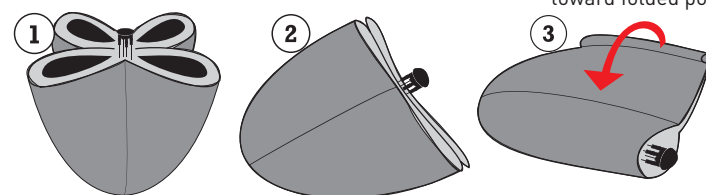


Gently lower the entire shelter down

**WARNING: Stand back when closing shelter-hub can move quickly.**



Unlock pole joints by slightly pulling pole sections apart.  
Holding central hub upright.  
Fold fabric and poles toward the hub.

**PACKING THE SHELTER**

1. Fold poles toward the central hub and allow loose fabric to flower out.  
2. Lay the folded shelter on its side. All poles should be tight to the hub in order to prevent poles damage.  
3. Bring all excess fabric together and roll tightly toward the central hub.
